3. Minutes of last Forum meeting (29th June 2023) and matters arising

The minutes of the last Forum meeting were agreed.

Matters arising – The Steering Group are yet to consider the need to develop a new, campaigning anti-poverty network.

4. Main Discussion Item - Housing/Homelessness

Elliott and Fran led the discussion, with numerous members contributing their experiences and knowledge. Key points included:

- Not enough affordable accommodation locally.
- Those seeking temporary accommodation are being housed further away than before Leicester was given as one example.

- Numerous people (including families) placed in inappropriate accommodation, with no cooking facilities.
- People returning to the UK for medical reasons often struggle to find accommodation.
- The increase in Section 21 (no fault) evictions as some landlords seek to cash in their assets, or seek to increase the rent level
- The impact of high interest rates on both landlords and homeowners with mortgages.
- Bedford CAB have a part-time Homeless Prevention Advisor, who has seen a huge demand for their support. Numerous members report similar increases in housing related enquiries.

Martin highlighted the Winter Shelter provision in Bedford being set up by Kings Arms Project (https://kingsarmsproject.org/volunteer/) and the ongoing conversations between Bedford Homeless Partnership and the Local Authority.

Update on BAF projects and activities

BAF training

BAF arranged a training programme in the spring for BAF members. The programme consisted of 3 full-day courses presented by 3 different trainers.

The training programme was very successful.

- In total 38 people attended the 3 courses
- The general feedback from the course evaluation forms was very positive. Across all 3 courses
 - > 100% fully felt the course fulfilled their **expectations**
 - > 100% fully felt that the course was at the **right level** for their needs
 - > 100% fully felt that the **knowledge/skills** they gained on this course would help them in their work
- In terms of more **specific opinions on the courses**, the overall average feedback from the evaluation forms across the 3 courses was also very positive.
 - Course structure and content 97% stated this was very good
 - Training materials 91% stated these were very good
 - Trainers and course delivery 100% stated these were very good
 - Venues 82% stated these were very good
- A surplus of £1,099.36 was made from the programme for BAF

The **recommendations** from the training programme, agreed by BAF's Steering Group, are:

- 1. BAF should run another training programme. Possibly in early 2024?
- **2.** BAF members should be asked what their **current training needs** are before planning the next programme, and their **preference for the training venue**.
- **3.** BAF should develop a **Cancellation Policy** to clarify how cancellations and potential refunds are dealt with.
